

A night for Aung San Suu Kyi

A Night for Aung San Suu Kyi is a benefit show in support of Burma's democracy leader who was arrested by the military government of Myanmar following a brutal crackdown on the democracy movement, on 30 May 2003. She has been held for a month in a hut built between the women's wing and the gallows in Rangoon's notorious Insein prison, with a clear view of the gallows. She is reported to have been secretly moved to another location on July 1st.

As a courageous believer in non-violent resistance, Daw Suu (as she is known for short) has been standing firm against Burma's military rulers for 15 years. She is an inspiration to the people of Burma and all freedom-loving people. **We want to let her know she does not stand alone.**

A Night for Aung San Suu Kyi features dance and song from Burma, Mark Laurent & Brenda Liddiard, Karen Hunter, Linn Lorkin & Hershel, Truda Chadwick and her Sisters, Russel Walder and more. There will be readings from 'Voice of Hope', Daw Suu's thoughts on life and freedom.
